Dear Learning Family,

Next week marks the start of our yearly assessments across the school. Our Year 6 children will be undertaking a series of tests next week that include reading, grammar, spelling and punctuation and mathematics. These tests are updated to assess the national curriculum that was introduced in 2014. A letter containing the time table and other details has been sent home to the Year 6 children.

In addition, our Year 2 children will be undertaking their SATS tests during the month of May; however these tests are used internally to check standards and inform the overall teacher assessment reported at the end of the year.

Over the month, other year groups too will be carrying out standardised tests as a check on attainment. We will use this information as part of our overall teacher assessment. The outcomes of these assessments will be reported in our annual reports which will be delivered in the final weeks of the academic year.

I, like many of you, have seen many negative reports about testing which has been in the media recently and I would like to stress testing is only part of Coton Green's Assessment Policy. We are very proud of our broad and balanced curriculum and the wide and varied opportunities that our teaching team work hard to arrange for the children. Our commitment to the arts, music, sport, educational visits, and the efforts made to work with agencies such as Bikeability, NSPCC and the fire service to keep our children informed of how to keep safe and healthy are rightly given the priority within our overall curriculum offer. Achievements in many other subject disciplines are highly regarded and are just as important as tests.

Our children, teachers and you as parents have worked so hard in preparing for these tests and we are delighted with all our children's efforts. Their commitment to 'be the best that they can possibly be' is exceptional. Next week, our Year 6 will be able to come to school from 8:00 with free toast so that they can be with their teachers and friends to allay any nerves. I wish all our children completing the tests over the next few weeks all the very best. I have advised them that all we ask them for is their own personal best and to make the most of the forecasted fine weather we are due this weekend!

Finally, could I advise parents that if they order lunches at the hatch that the hall must be cleared by 9:00 as it is being used for Year 6 SATS. Alternatively, parents can complete any menus and hand in to their child's teacher or the office.

The school is looking to appoint 4 friendly and caring individuals to join our school team. Our lunchtime supervisors undertake a most important role within school and for this we are keen to appoint the right individuals. We require approachable, friendly and flexible members of staff one to work for 6.25 hours per week, 12.15 – 1.30pm Monday to Friday and one casual to work the same hours but on an adhoc basis as and when required. The successful applicants will be expected to:

• Working under the direction and instruction of senior staff provide the care of the children during the school lunch break.

- Escorting pupils to and from the school dining room
- Supervision of children before, during and after the meal
- Supervision of children bringing sandwiches
- Summoning help, where necessary, in case of injury or illness and providing basic first aid for minor injuries (for which training will be available)
