They will begin to negotiate space successfully when playing racing and chasing games, adjusting speed and direction to avoid obstacles. Children will have the opportunity to show increasing control over objects by pushing, patting, throwing, catching or kicking. Fine Motor Children will continue to develop their control and coordination of small-scale movements. We will be ensuring that children consistently hold their pencils using a tripod grip, forming recognisable letters with increasing accuracy. Children will improve small scale movements through the safe and effective use of simple one-handed tools, with increasing control.
