### A WEEK AT COTON GREEN...

Reception- EYFS had a very mysterious start to school this week, with the children arriving to a strange scene in the Home Corner- a visitor had been and made a mess! After some fantastic detective work, they finally concluded that the mysterious visitor must have been... Goldilocks! The biggest clue was the boxes of porridge left on the floor!

They have listened carefully to the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears, created story maps, made actions to help them retell the story, and acted out the story with some brilliant character voices. In maths, the children have used the song '5 Little Speckled Frogs" to helps them learn different ways to make 5, thinking carefully about how many frogs are on the log and how many are in the pool. They have also been investigating the world around them, focusing on cold climates and what clothing they might need to help them keep warm. A wonderful week EYFS, well done!



KS1-

Year 1 have had a wonderful week! In maths, they have continued to learn about numbers to 20, identifying which number is greater/less than another given number. In English, children have been writing the first part of our story 'Hibernation Hotel' and have had a conversation as if they were the BellBoy. In our Geography lessons, Year 1 have looked at the UK and which countries it contains. A fabulous second week back Y1!

Year 2 have been working so hard this week! In maths, they have continued to learn about money and have been investigating ways to make the same amount using different coins. In English, children have been writing letters of advice to the main characters in our story 'The Bear and the Piano' and have been editing their letters too. In our 'My Happy Mind' lessons, Year 2 have learnt about what 'gratitude' means and ways that they can show their gratitude to others. A fantastic week Year 2, well done!

#### LKS2-


Year 3/4 have had a great week! We have been finding out about counties in our Geography and researching what some counties are famous for like Staffordshire's ginger pigs! In Maths, year 4 have been exploring place value - multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100, Year 3 have been linking multiplication and division using two-digit numbers multiplied and divided by 1-digit numbers. In English, the children have planned and started drafting a fantasy magical story based upon Leon and the Place Between by Grahame Baker Smith; we are so excited to read them!
