Reception-What a super week EYFS have had to end the half term! In English, children have been retelling the story of The Three Little Pigs- writing their own sentences. They have worked tremendously hard to ensure letters sit on the line and are formed accurately. In maths, children have enjoyed exploring the staircase pattern of Numberblocks to 8. They have been using stem sentences to compare numbers using 'more than' and 'fewer than'. Children have also completed the 'appreciate' module of 'My Happy Mind'. They have reflected upon things they are grateful for, thinking about themselves and others. Well done for a fantastic half term, Reception! We hope you have a lovely week off with your families. Please enjoy reading your new reading books with a grown up to showcase your amazing learning.

KS1- What a busy half term we've had in Year one and this week has been no different. We had a visit on Tuesday by our local PCSO talking to us about what he does and showing us his police car!

We have been busy in Literacy finding out about Emily Brown and Stanley and the adventures they get up to. Heading off to space looked very exciting as did driving across the Sahara desert!

In maths we have been learning about the 'inverse' and writing number sentences from part part whole models and bar models. We are getting very good at this showing our great understanding. LKS2- Year 3/4 have had a fantastic week! From writing diary entries as Sophie from the BFG to comparing different parts of the UK in Geography, we have tackled every task with enthusiasm. For Safer Internet day on Tuesday, Year 3/4 created some fantastic superheroes to protect us all from scammers. With superpowers like 'encryption rays' and 'password shields' we all feel a lot safer now! In Maths, Y3 have been developing their length and perimeter knowledge and skills, while Y4 have been calculating equivalent lengths. It's been a busy, but very fun week!
