


COTON GREEN NEWSLETTER

A WEEK AT COTON GREEN...

Reception-

This week in EYFS, the children have been exploring the world around them, focussing on the signs of winter. The children enjoyed their walk around school, making winter observations such as tress with no leaves, an icy playground. They had some great discussions about where the ice had come from and what happens when it melts. In English, we have been practising the art of storytelling through the book 'One Snowy Night'. They have developed using storyteller voices, using expressions and actions to help us. In Maths, we have been developed our knowledge of numbers to 5, adding 1 more to a number and putting numbers in order. We have also been using our class iPads this week, where we have been practising taking good photos and editing them to write our name on each photo.



KS1- This week in Y1, the children have been predicting what they think will happen in their new text 'Hibernation Hotel'. They have enjoyed reading the story so far and used voicenotes on their iPads to orally rehearse their sentences. In maths, children have been using maths resources to embed their numbers to 20 and recognise them on a range of number lines. During science, Y1 have been investigating seasons and have been discussing what their favourite season is and why.

Y2 have had a fantastic first week back! They were very excited to find a bear playing a piano in the corridor and have made predictions in English this week about what they think might happen. They also created a super conscience alley about what the bear should do in the story. In maths, Y2 have been learning about money and finding out what value the coins and notes have. They have enjoyed adding coins and notes together and creating different amounts. In art, the children enjoying painting using different tools and created some fantastic art work!

LKS1-

What an amazing first week back year 3/4 have had! They have all enjoyed learning about the UK and using their I-pads to research cities in the UK and plotting them on their own maps. In English, they have been inferring the characters emotions from the text 'Leon and the place between.' They especially loved role playing the characters from the book. In Maths, they have all been working hard to learn their times tables, which class will win the TT Rockstar battle this term? They have all come back into school refreshed and with fantastic learning attitudes!



UKS2-

This week in 5/6, we have enjoyed being archaeologists and discovering ancient artifacts linked to our new English book: Beowulf. Jumping straight into the plot, we worked as class to advise King Hrothgar about how he could escape the wrath of Grendel the monster using adverbs and modal verbs. In maths Year 5 have shown great resilience and tackled multiplying by a two-digit number while Year 6 have been adding, subtracting and rounding decimals! Moreover, in RE, we have looked at the different ways marriages are celebrated in the UK. A surprising favourite for many this week has to be putting our fitness levels to the test when completing circuits with Mr Parker in PE.
